to make them like you.





## Introduction

History of Children's Services in the Western Region

The materials in this Kit, the booklets, video, the photos and the project documents are the result of a nine months Living Library Project on the History of Children's Services in the Western Region by the Crow Collection Association.

The booklets are numbered 1 to 12 with the numbering on the preface pages. The numbering, more or less corresponding to the chronological order of the information.

Booklet Number 11, "Putting Magic in the Lives of Children - Participation in the Lives of Parents" is the Project Report by Sheila Byard and Christine Carolan. As readers may like to browse through this publication before reading the others it is placed first in the booklet, and thus is not in its serial number as listed on the Contents.

The title of the Project Report places the Project in its historic setting.

"Magic in the Lives of Children" was a slogan used in the early 1940s to popularise the need for preschool education. Thirty years later the community child care movement of the 1970s emphasised the need for parent involvement in the services provided for the children and thus the phrase "Participation in the Lives of Parents" gained in popularity.

What phrases will be used to epitomise relationships between children, parents and the community in the future?

Children need magic in their lives, parents need to participate in the planning and administration of services that are provided for their children, but what else?

What challenges face those who are concerned about the relationships between children, parents and society?

What words will be used to express these changing values ?

This project aimed at involving individuals and community organisations in searching for the answers to these questions.
