#### Community Involvement (Child Care)

Here are some examples of helping to campaign for new types of services and involvement in establishing them :-

Sec of South Yarra Day Nursery (subsidised by Federal Govt. from 1943 c) 1945..1947 Member and later Hon Sec of Day Nursery Development Association (campaign to re-establish wartime children's centres and to improve creches). to 1952 Helped with children's cultural 1948 activities, e.g. children's art (Asian/ Australian Exchange), children's dance (Unity Children's Art Group), children's theatre (New Theatre), children's singing (Austral Singers) etc. 1957 to 1960 (c) Hon Sec of <u>Coburq Education</u> <u>Committee</u> which was supported by Coburg Council, preschool on school and education research facilities in that municipality. 1969 to 1972 Hon Sec Action for Adequate child Care

1969 to 1972 Hon Sec Action for Adequate child Care (a trade union/community based organisation which campaigned for Federal funding of child care.

1973 to 1981 Member of Committee of Management of Community Child Care helped to establish new types of centres for young children in Kensington, North Melb etc as well as to establish networks of child care centres, helped establish "Ripple" (CCC newsletter).

1979 to 1981 helped to prepare <u>Melbourne City</u> <u>Council Report on Children's Services</u> ("Planning for the 1980s). On initiating committee for <u>Melbourne Municipal Association of Children's and Youth Services</u>.

1981 Prepared <u>history of children's services</u> in the Melbourne Municipality.

## Community Involvement (Urban Issues)

1968 initiating groups for North Melbourne on Association and the North Melbourne Social Service 1972 Awarded (jointly with my husband Maurie) by the Royal Aust. Architect a Robin Boyd Award for our "contribution to the literature of town Planning" 1973 Awarded (jointly with my husband) by the Town and Country planning Association the Barrett Medal "for a notable contribution to planning". 1968...1989 Involved in campaigns of the North Melbourne Association making a particular contribution to helping to prepare alternative plans.

1975 Helped to organise the <u>National Radical Ecology</u> <u>Conference</u> which was organised around participatory activities.

1976 (c) helped to establish the <u>North Melbourne</u> <u>Neighbourhood Centre</u>.

1978 (c) helped to establish the North Melbourne News, a community newspaper which has existed for past ten years and is probably one of the longest surviving of all community newspapers.

### Community Involvement (Health and Nutrition)

My first abiding interest in human issues was about food, health and income. In the 1930s the first step to being a dietitian was the Diploma of Institutional Management. However I married soon after I had gained my diploma and I was therefore not eligible for employment at hospitals. I am still very interested in social solutions to nutritional problems but have not been greatly involved in this in recent years.
