Minutes of the meeting of the Regional Comordinating Committee held on Sunday 29th June at 2:00pm. at Claire Slatter's flat Des Vouex Road, Suva Fiji.

Present: Claire Slatter, Vimal Madhavan, Amelia Rokotuivuna (Acting Co-ordinator).
Amelia choired the meeting.

Agenda: as circulated at the meeting was accepted.

Business:-

a. Administration:

- (i) <u>Location</u> Agreed that the office be located in Suva, Fiji and the situation be reviewed after a year.
- (ii) Finance The budget that was presented in the project document for funding be not revised. That by end of August a financial statement be given so that some idea of cash flow be established. Agreed that the bank be changed to the National Bank of Fiji. Agreed that the Acting Co-ordinator arranges that some money be put infixed deposit.
- (iii) Office The YWCA be paid up to July 13th when the office will be shifted to the SCM office. Agreed that the PPAF pay two-thirds of SCM office rent and a letter be written to SCM to that effect. It was agreed that a small sum be used for rennovating the office painting and shelving. The type-writer and duplicator should also be repaired and serviced.
- (iv) Staff Agreed that Amelia Rokotuivuna to work as Co-ordinator for a year when the situation will be reviewed. That at the moment no other staff member be recruited until the need arises and finances are available.

b. Role of PPAF:-

- (i) Its role in relation to Pacific Concerns Resource Centre (PCRC) The meeting was aware that the work of PPAF and PCRC will overlap, but rather than make a decision on the division of labour it decided that Amelia Rokotuivuma should discuss the matter with the PCRC Co-ordinating Committee while in Honolulu and report the substance of that meeting to the PPAF Regional Co-ordinating Committee on return. The meeting also felt that after a year of working together the areas of responsibility of each will become clearer.
- (ii) Its role in relation to PCC The Acting Co-ordinator, Amelia R. reported on the meetings she has had with Rev. David Williams (Jnr),
 Co-ordinator of the Church and Society Programme of PCC. Amelia
 stated that PPAF could work with PCC on studies on Transnational
 Corporations particularly in forming a group that could work with the
 mission interns of the PCC. This agreed to as long as the PPAF does
 not have to deal with the PCC bureaucracy.

(iii) Its role in relation to work in Fiji - Agreed that PPAF must initiate moves to establish again an equivalent body to what ATOM Committee used to be to be responsible for work within Fiji.

c. Membership of PPAF:-

- (i) Membership Because of the changing situations since 1975 and 1978

 Conferences a circular need to be sent out to organisations and individuals who have attended both conferences to find out how they feel now.
- (ii) Financial Commitment Now that funds for the first year of operation has come through the attendants of 1978 Ponape Conference need to be reminded of the collective financial commitment which was to provide one-third of the budget.
- (iii) Additional Co-ordinating Bodies Countries need to be reminded and encouraged to establish and maintain national co-ordinating bodies.

d. Status of PPAF:-

- (i) Agreed to register as it will offer extra protection and a legal status.
- (ii) Agreed to draw up a statement of purpose.

 Both (i) and (ii) above will help give legal status to the organisation.

e. Programmes:-

- (i) POVAI Agreed that publication be not started until the total funding for the next three years is ensured.
- (ii) Agreed that a monthly newsletter be published.
- (iii) Agreed that exchange arrangement be made with other papers so as we can get their news and they ours.
